**Results of the Evaluation Feedback Survey on ToT
Course on “*Hybrid/Blended Teaching and Learning*”
Conducted at FH JOANNEUM**

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INTRODUCTION

The ToT on **Hybrid/Blended Teaching and Learning** held in Graz, Austria at the FH JOANNEUM between the 5th and the 9th November 2018 aimed to support teachers in enhancing their teaching qualifications with competences in the field of new and innovative media in order to meet the current needs of the students. The introduction of blended learning and teaching concept was the basis of a wide span of e- learning & teaching methodologies. Starting from E-moderating and how the teacher role has changed, through to how to deal with an e-learning platform, creating online portfolios, learning materials for blended learning scenarios, further mentioning online project management tools and the impact of culture on the teaching and learning process.

The main objective of the Evaluation Analysis Report is to understand whether or not the the Trainers who attended the Training were satisfied with the training content, quality of instruction, facilities, overall impression and foremost with the benefits and results of the training.

The online questionnaire for ToT Course evaluation survey was sent out on the 23rd of November 2018 to the 19 course participants with the following link: <https://docs.google.com/forms/d/1HNnRX9hnsAlf5wi767gnzwj0Kl6JbmCo0EOAaULErKQ/edit?usp=sharing>. The participants were asked to indicate their level of agreement and rate the training on a scale from 0 to 5, as follows:

0 = Not applicable (Choose N/A if the item is not appropriate or not applicable to this training)

1 = Strongly disagree, or the lowest, most negative impression

2 = Disagree

3 = Neutral (Neither agree nor disagree), or an adequate impression

4 = Agree

5 = Strongly agree, or the highest, most positive impression

At the end of this evaluation report an analysis of comments by the participants was done in order to detect potential weak points and room for improvement regarding the training.

The results of the questionnaires provide a good basis for a possible adaptation of the training for future use. Besides, these surveys offer benefits to the whole partnership, as it aims to assess the quality and the effectiveness of the course for future use.

The Evaluation Analysis Report deals with analysis the online questionnaire sent to the participants who were selected to take part of the ToT on **Hybrid/Blended Teaching and Learning** Course of the project PRINTEL. The online questionnaire was filled by all 19 participants.

SECTION-1. OBJECTIVES OF THE TRAINING COURSE

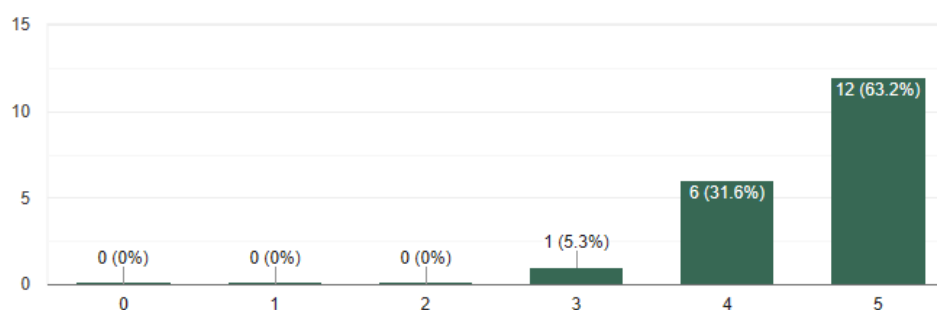
The following analysis report is based on the abovementioned online questionnaire which and summarises the feedback of the training participants.

As shown in the diagram below, the first evaluation step concerns the personal statements about the objectives of the Training Course. The following items were asked:

- The objectives of the training were clearly stated in syllabus.
- The topics covered were relevant for the innovative and/or technology enhanced teaching & learning.
- I was well informed about the objectives.

1.1. The objectives of the training were clearly stated in syllabus.

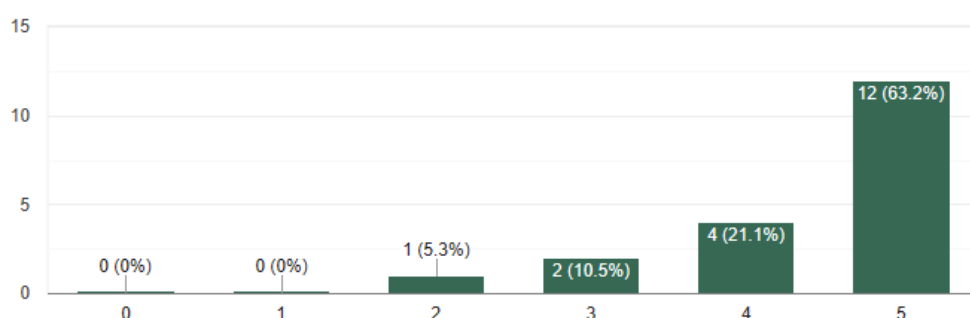


The results were quite positive. The majority of the respondents (12) were clearly aware of the training objectives (Strongly agree.) Only 1 respondent disagree. 6 respondents agree the objectives of the training were clear.

1.2. The topics covered were relevant for the innovative and/or technology enhanced teaching & learning.

Regarding the relevance of the topics covered as to innovative teaching and learning the results were also quite positive (12 respondents strongly agree), however 4 respondents agreed and 2 were neutral about the relevance of the topics. Only 1 respondent disagreed.

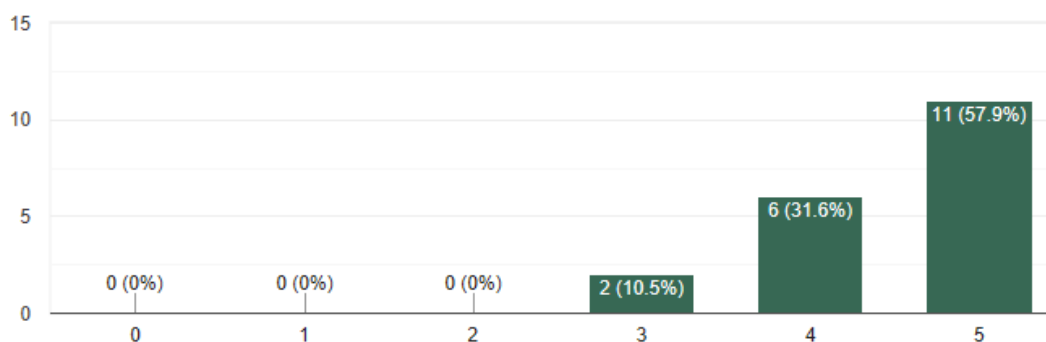

Most of the respondents felt they were well informed about the objectives- 11 respondents strongly agreed, 6 agreed. Just a small percentage (2) felt otherwise.

Even though only one comment was given in this section, it gave a positive impression of the section content.

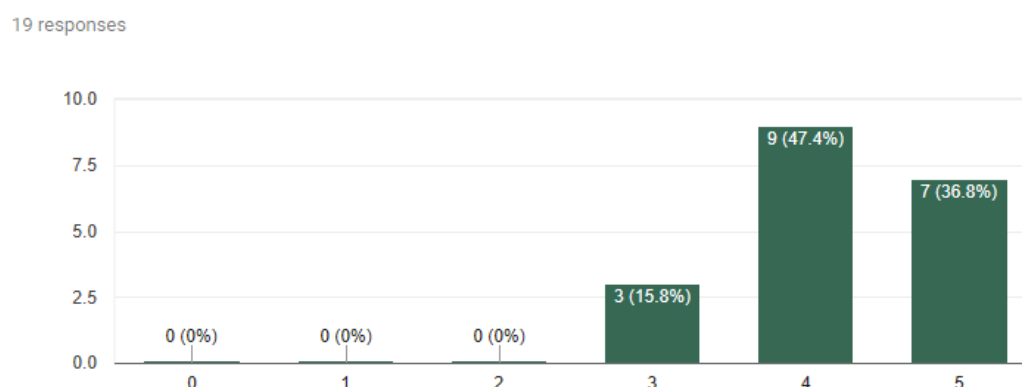

SECTION-2. TRAINING CONTENT

The following charts deal with the Training content and whether or not the participants considered it appropriate, well-structured and relevant.

2.1. The training content was appropriate to the title and objectives of the course.

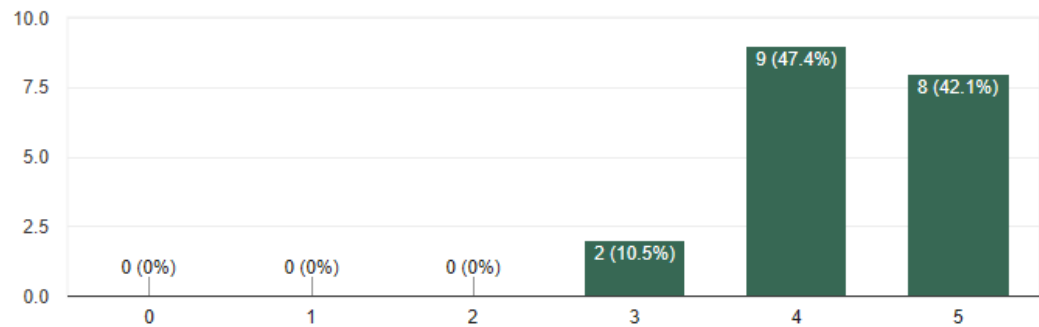


Here the outcomes were genuinely positive as 9 respondents agree and 7 strongly agree that the training content was appropriate to the title and objectives of the course. 3 respondents were neutral.

2.2. The content was well-structured and easy to follow.

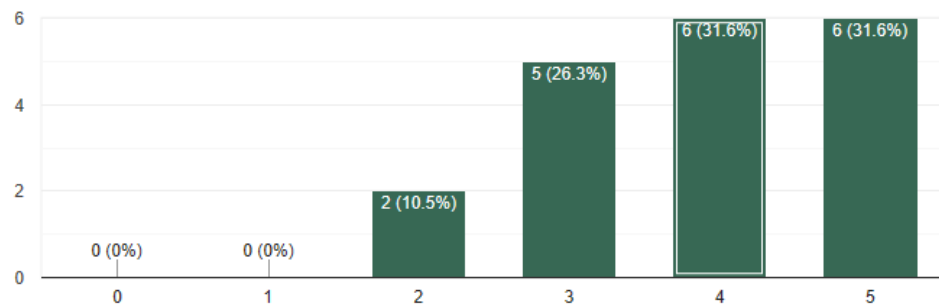
Again, the respondents answered very positively as to how easy to follow and well-structured the content was: 9 respondents agreed and 8 strongly agreed. 2 respondents were neutral.

In this diagram the results were mixed, though positive. The majority of the respondents found the content relevant to their expectations (6 strongly agree, 6 agree). 5 have a neutral response, and 2 participants disagree.

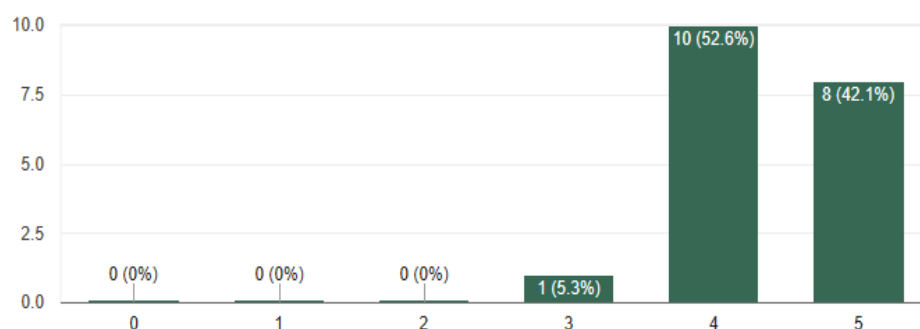
SECTION-3. QUALITY OF THE INSTRUCTION

As a next step the respondents were asked to assess the quality of instruction. Therefore, they were asked to evaluate:

- Variety of instructional methods & learning activities
- Training methods & activities
- Participation & Interaction

3.1. A variety of instructional methods & learning activities were used to achieve the training objectives (e.g. instructor and participant presentations, group discussions and works, etc.).

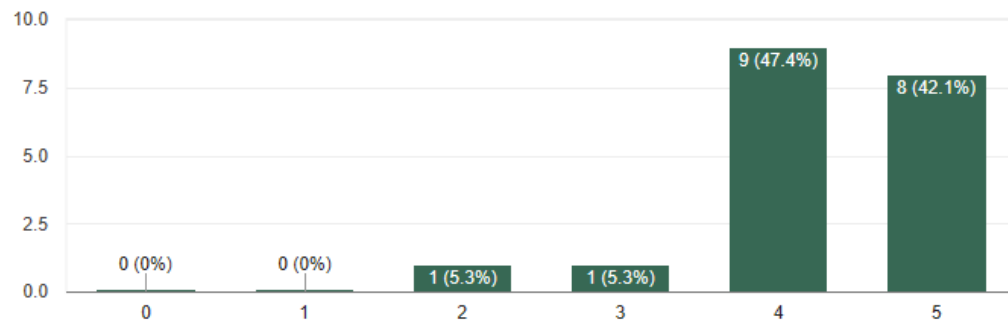


Again relatively high number of positive answers. Furthermore, only 1 neutral answer.

3.2. The training methods & activities kept the participants interested in the topics and stimulated their learning.

In this diagram, although a high number of respondents (9 agreed, 8 strongly agreed) felt that the training methods & activities kept the participants interested in the topics and stimulated their learning, there were still 1 respondent who disagreed.

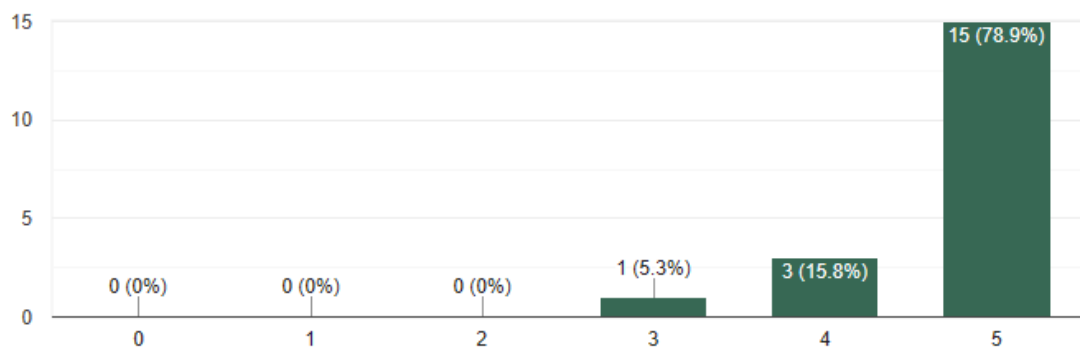

SECTION-4. TRAINING ENVIRONMENT AND RESOURCES/FACILITIES

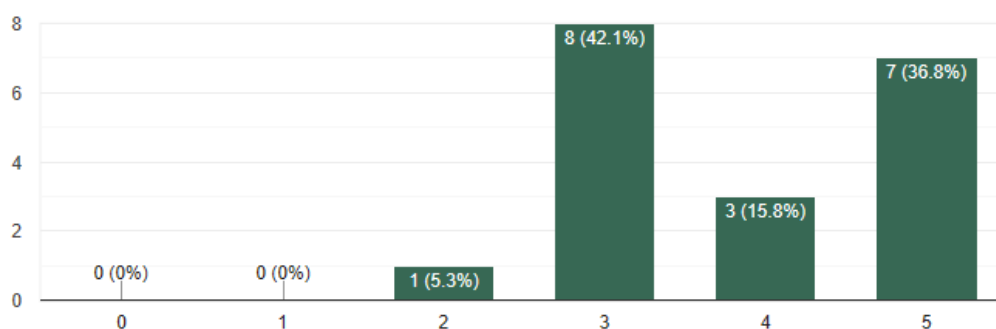
In this section the respondents were asked to rate the training environment/ facilities, as follows:

- Comfortable/suitable
- Adequate training materials
- Usefulness of leaning materials

4.1. The training rooms and facilities were comfortable and suitable to the learning needs.

Although apparently the participants seemed to be have found the facilities comfortable and suitable for the learning needs (7 strongly agree and 3 agree), a high rate also gave a neutral answer (8 respondents). 1 respondent did not agree.

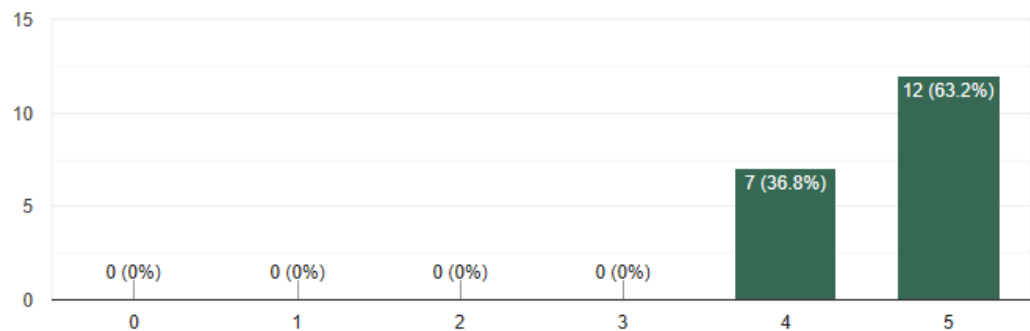

Absolutely positive the answers regarding the support learning materials. 12 respondents strongly agree and 7 agree that the adequate learning materials were used.

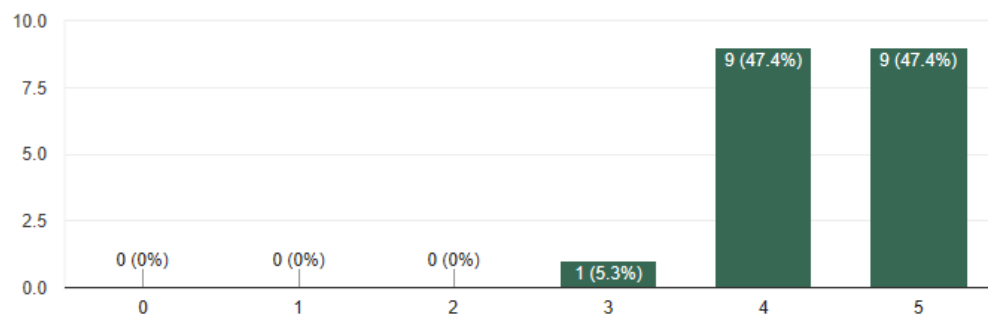

SECTION-5. TRAINERS/INSTRUCTORS

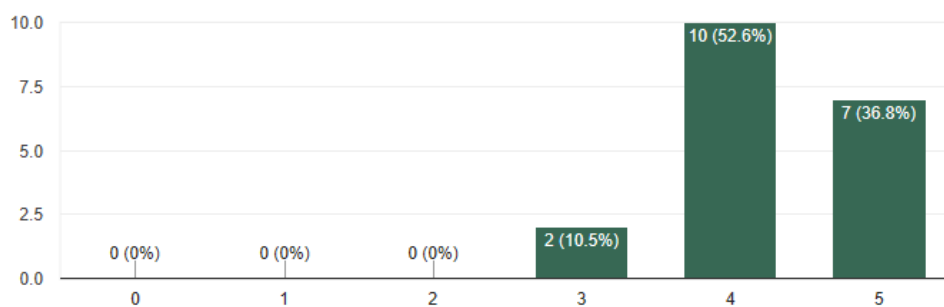
The next question deals with the trainers/ instructors assessment, namely how knowledgeable, well prepared and interacted with the participants.

In the diagram below it is noticeable that the majority of the respondents considered that the trainers demonstrated in -depth knowledge of the training topics.

10 respondents agree and 7 strongly agree. 2 respondents have a neutral response. In total the outcome is positive.

5.1. The trainers demonstrated in-depth knowledge of the training topics.

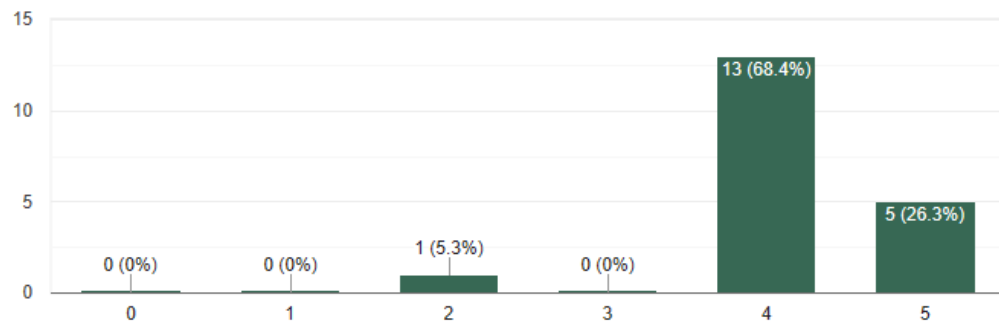

Although 13 respondents (agree) and 5 (strongly agree) that then trainers were well prepared for this particular training, 1 respondent disagreed and felt otherwise.

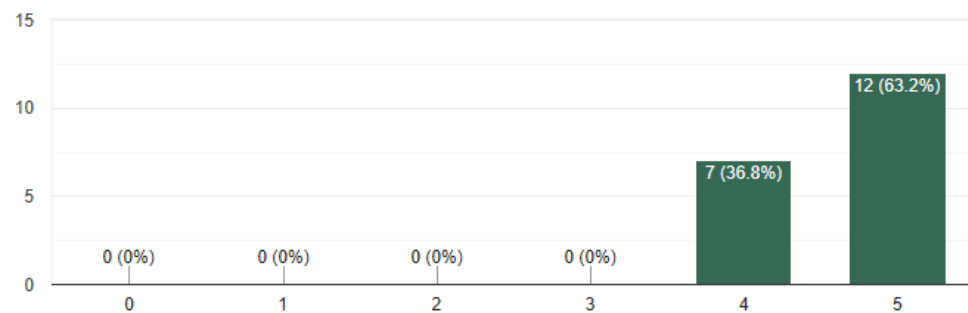

SECTION-6. TIME MANAGEMENT

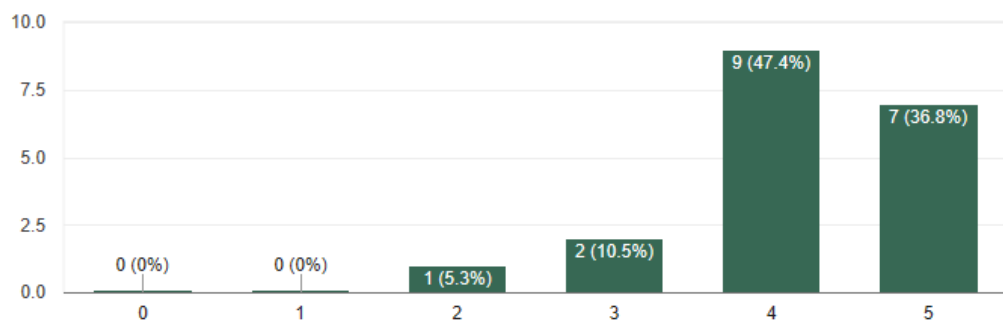
The participants were asked in this section to address Time Management during the training.

Analyzing the diagram below, it is visible that some participants would have liked to have had more time during the training.

For a good number of participants – 9 agree and 7 strongly agree- time allotted was sufficient. Nevertheless 1 participant disagreed. 2 respondents were neutral.

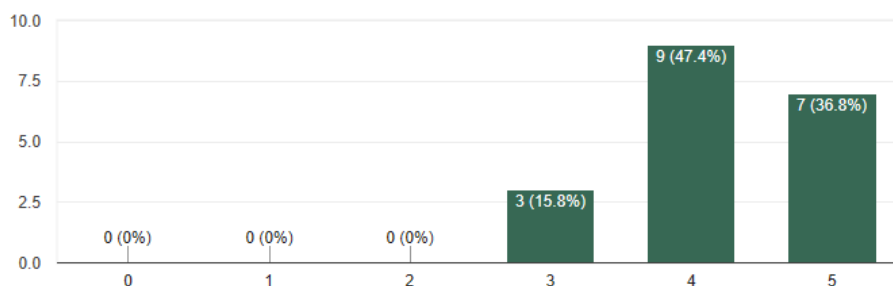
1.1. The time allotted for the training was sufficient.

1.2. The allotted time for the training was used effectively by trainers.

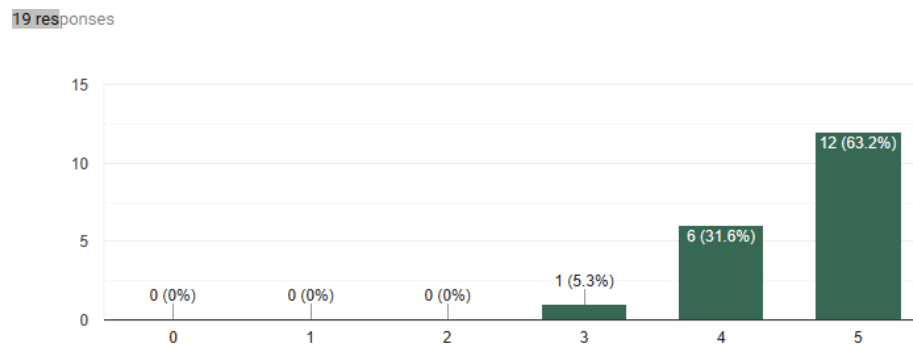

Too much time was dedicated to "group discussions" on several occasions.

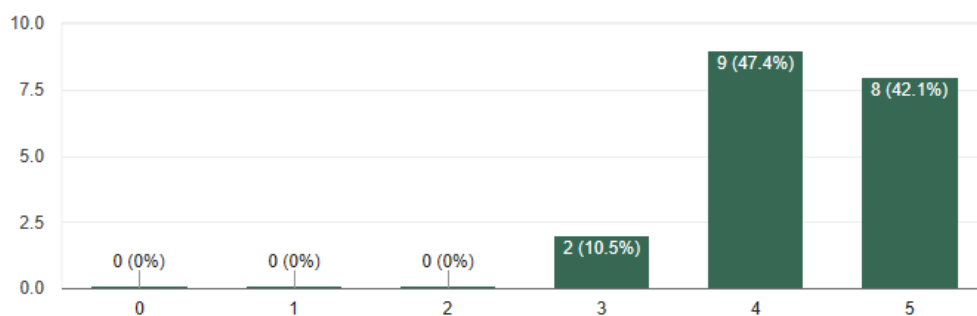
SECTION-7. BENEFITS/RESULTS

The next question deals with the expected benefits /results from the ToT Course on Hybrid/Blended Teaching and Learning.

It can be seen (in the chart below) that all the participants state they have acquired new skills on innovative and technology enhanced teaching and learning. 8 strongly agree, 9 agree and 2 maintain a neutral answer.

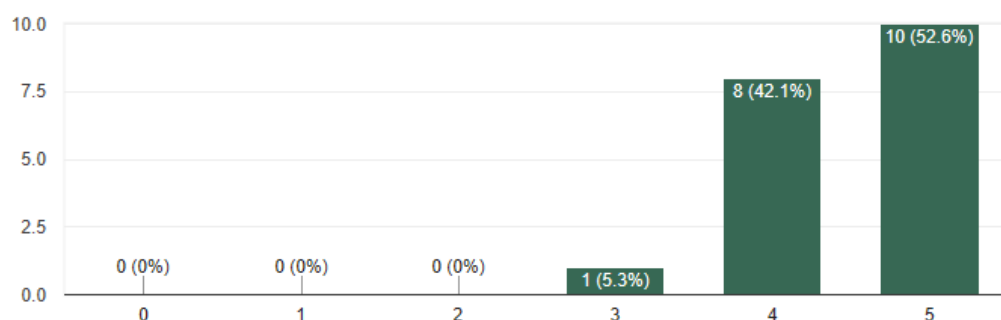
7.1. The participants acquired new skills on innovative and technology enhanced teaching and learning.

7.2. The participants will be able to apply acquired skills in their teaching practice.

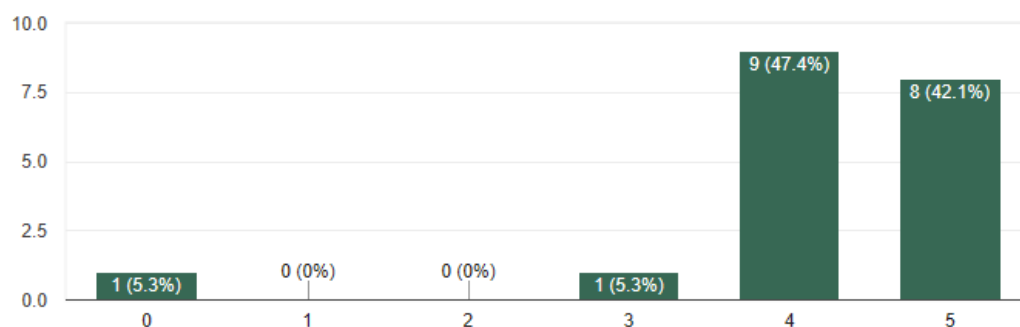

Participants are quite aware that this training provided them with the tools/skills to start developing their own strategies as to develop their own trainings.

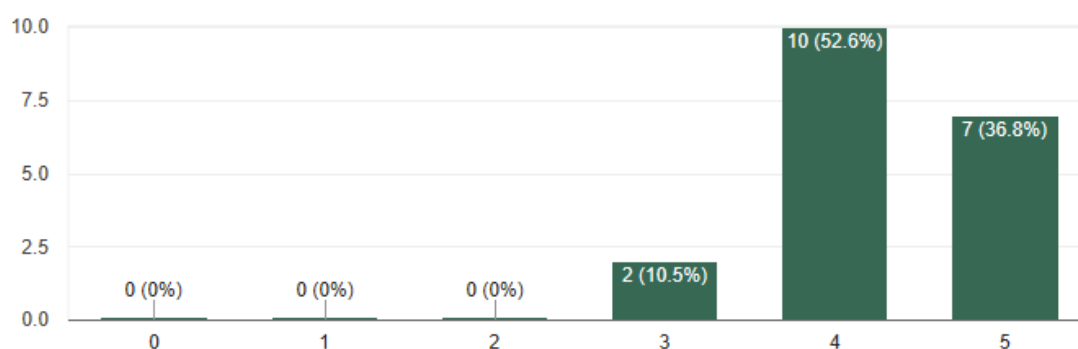
SECTION-8. OVERALL IMPRESSION

19 responses

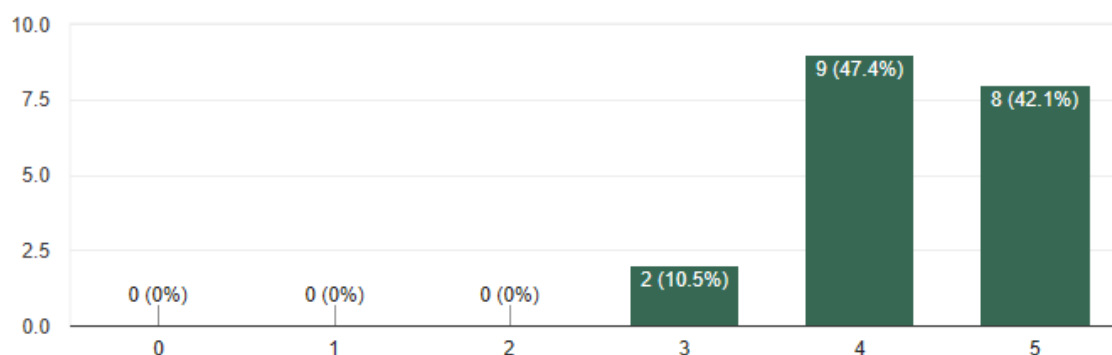


Very positive outcome on the rating of the content and delivery of training with 10 strongly agree responses and 7 agree. There were 2 neutral answers.

8.2. The participants' overall rating of their experience in the training.

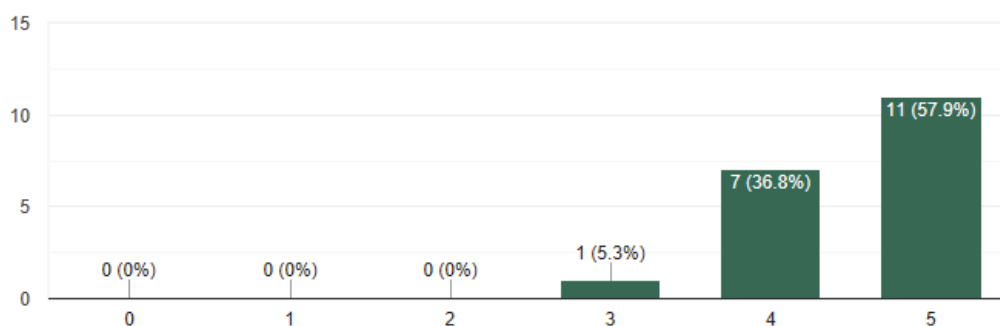
Similar outcome regarding the personal experience in the training. Apart from 2 neutral answers, all remaining respondents were positive.

Very good feedback in terms of how this experience was perceived as a whole.

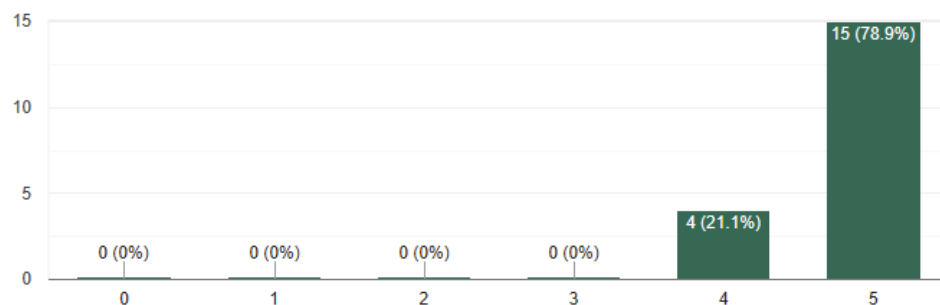
SECTION-10. OVERALL ORGANISATION OF THE EVENT

10.1. The participants have received the training materials (course abstract, syllabus/detailed training program, content materials, etc.) well-in advance.

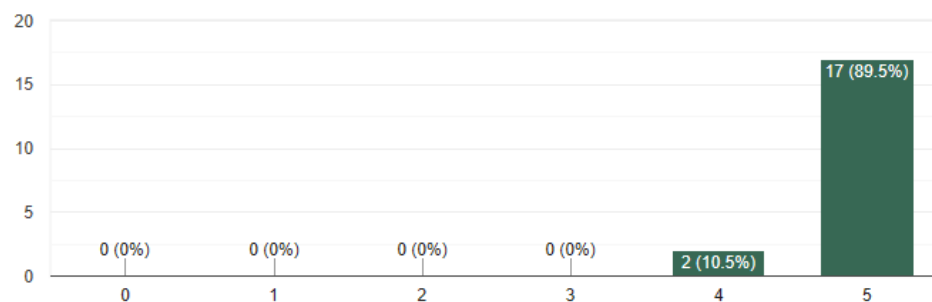
19 responses

10.2. The participants have received timely support in getting accommodation and travelling.

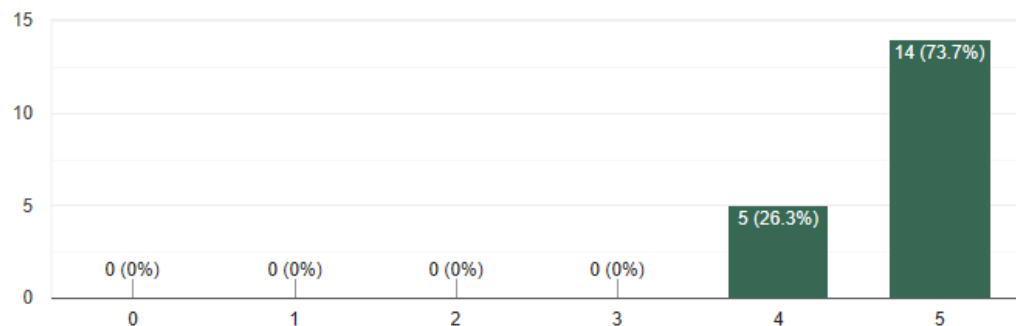

10.3. Social activities and the catering (coffee breaks, lunches, joint dinner, excursion, etc.) were well organized.

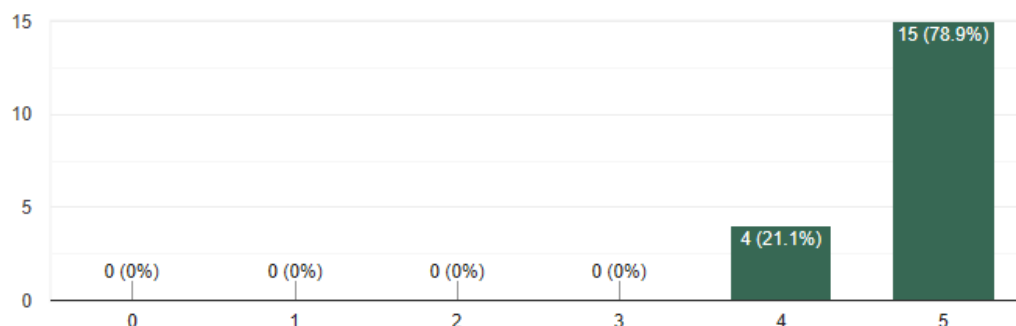

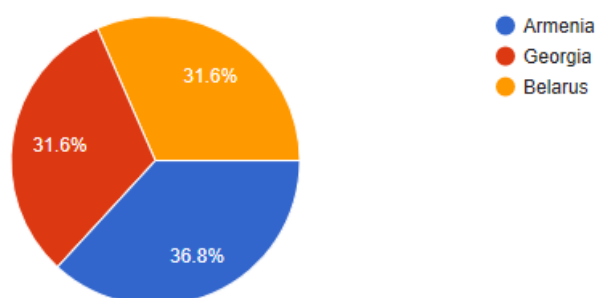

The diagram above tells us that the same percentage of respondents from Georgia and Belarus (31,6%) filled in the questionnaire. A slightly higher percentage of respondents (36,8) is from Armenia.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion the results of the questionnaire suggest that the expectations towards the training met the outcome. Also the evaluation of each section show that the level of satisfaction was extremely positive and participants highly appreciated and benefited from the training provided.

There are only some points that could be improved or added:

- The room facilities could be better
- Some respondents wanted to have more time, as they found the pace of work quite intense
- Some of the participants wanted to have a more practical approach for a better implementation on their home institutions

The questionnaire showed that the respondents were very much satisfied with the training course. It also reflected that the content of the training course was well chosen by the partnership. There is however still a knowledge and competence gap on Hybrid/Blended Teaching and Learning of some of the respondents that needs to be closed.

To highlight is the fact that the Online tools to support Project Based Learning content, where Innovative teaching/ blended learning methods were discussed, has provided a whole range of new tools, our participants did not know about, and very actively seek to implement in their institutions.

Beside the fact that the expectations were met, the questionnaire results demonstrate that the participants really learnt a lot, as they perceived that they increased the knowledge and competences and that a vast majority now feel comfortable in inserting and using the learning methods taught in the course, on their own classes and institutions.
