Overview of the Training

Within the framework of Eurocommission funded Erasmus+ program, “PRINTeL” – Change in Classroom: Promoting Innovative Teaching & Learning to Enhance Student Learning Experience in Eastern Partnership Countries,” at Georgian Technical University (Georgia), Training course on Innovative pedagogy method: “Active Learning in the Flipped Classroom” Method was held on 11-15 March. 5-day-training course has been attended by 24 lecturers from different faculties and departments at Georgian Technical University.

Some Statistical Informations:

Total Number of Participants - 24; Male: 5 – 20%; Female: 19 - 80%; Average age: 40 years old; Assistance professors – 6 – 25 %; Associated professors – 14 – 59 %; Professors – 1 - 4 %; Others – 3 – 12%;

The course was led by associate professor Boris Gitolendia (Transportation and Mechanical Engineering Faculty), who on his side completed ToT course of the PRINTeL project in Linköping University (Sweden). 10 sufficiently overloaded and intensive working hours included different activities like sessions and lectures; practical and group workshops; team and individual presentations and role games. The trainings also included redesigning of lecture courses and practical works in creating video lectures with MS PowerPoint.

The training course was entirely based on the experience of Linköping University and other International partners. Academic staff of GTU were attending the trainings; all participants who completed the course were awarded with certificates. The trainings were conducted in partnership with Teaching Staff Development Center of GTU Innovations Center (That was founded on the basis of PRINTeL capacity building context) and GTU Center of Professional Development.

Survey Results

At the end of the training, the participants submitted evaluation forms. From all participants we got 24 responses; the training goals and objectives were evaluated in the first section of the five. 24 trainees (that is 100%) agreed that the goals and objectives were clearly defined in the syllabus (see Chart 1). Then, 100% agreed that training objectives and content was relevant to their expectations (see Chart 2 and 3).

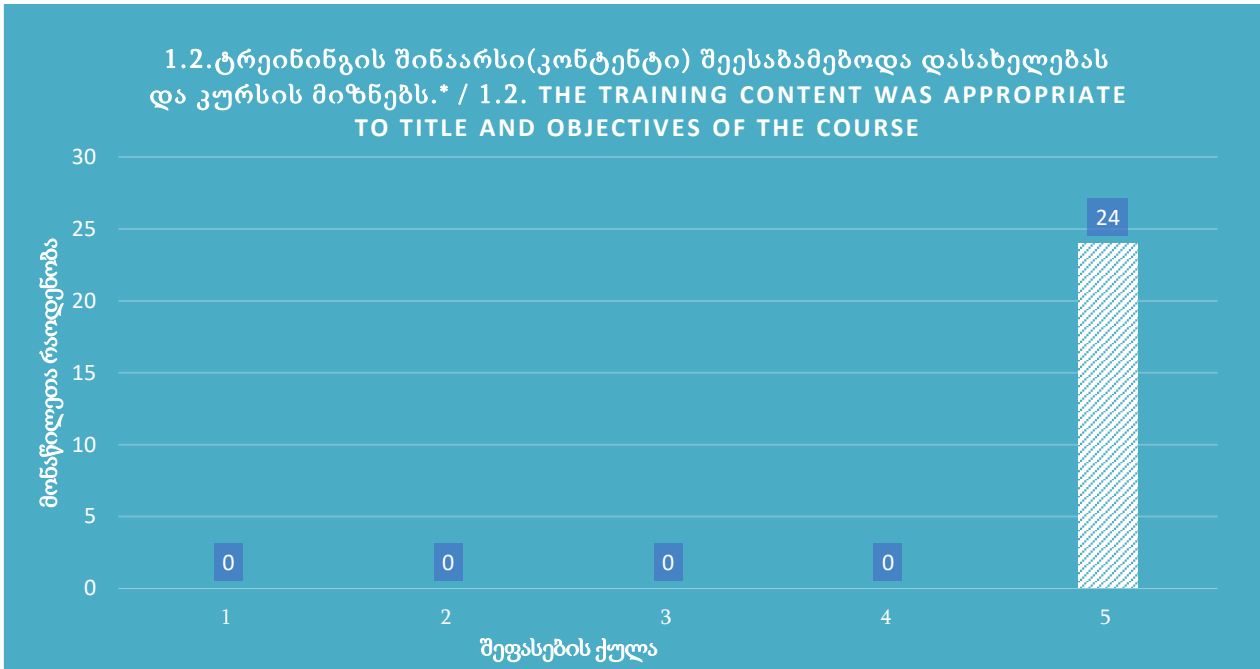

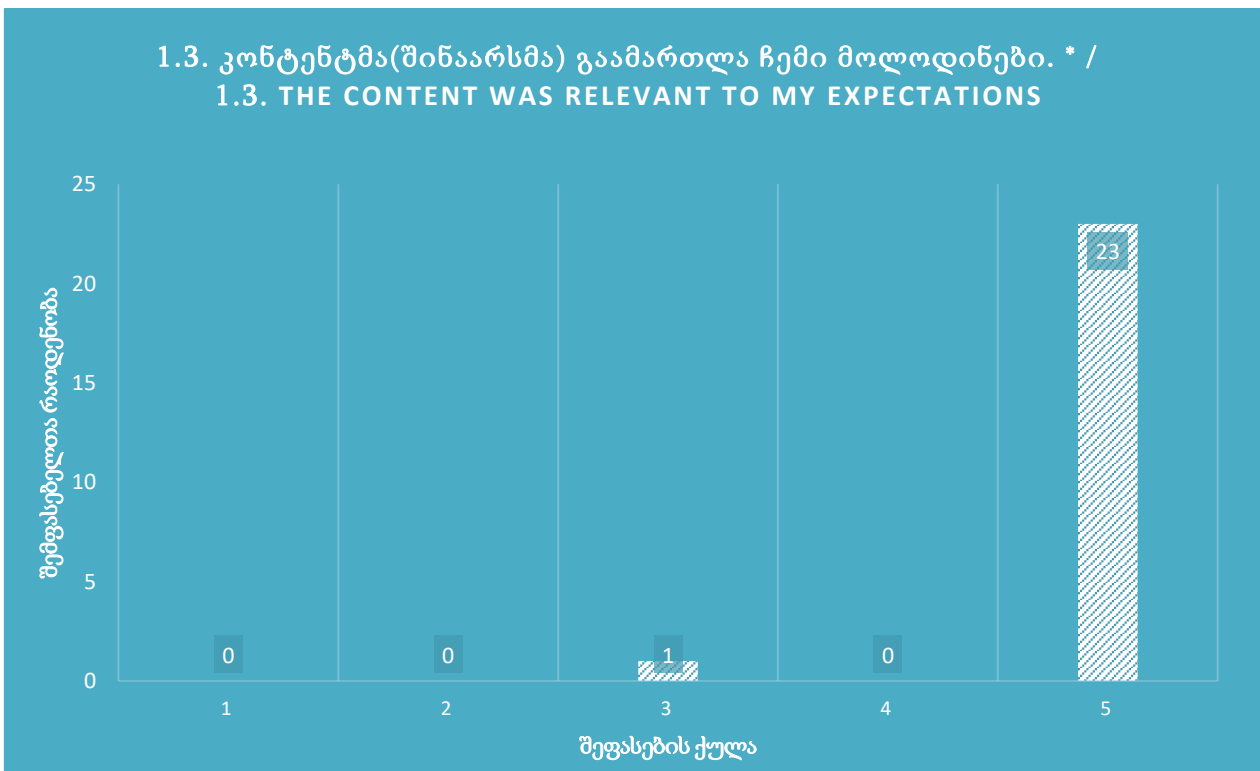

In Section 2, to the 2.1. Question 23 the trainees (99%) agreed that the innovative methods and well-prepared instructional activities were used and delivered in the course (see Chart 4). 23 out of 24 responded positively (99%) to 2.2 and the training methods and activities kept me interested in the topics and stimulated my learning (see Chart 5). Also 100% of trainees agreed 2.3 - Participation and interaction during the training were encouraged questions respectively. (See Chart 6).

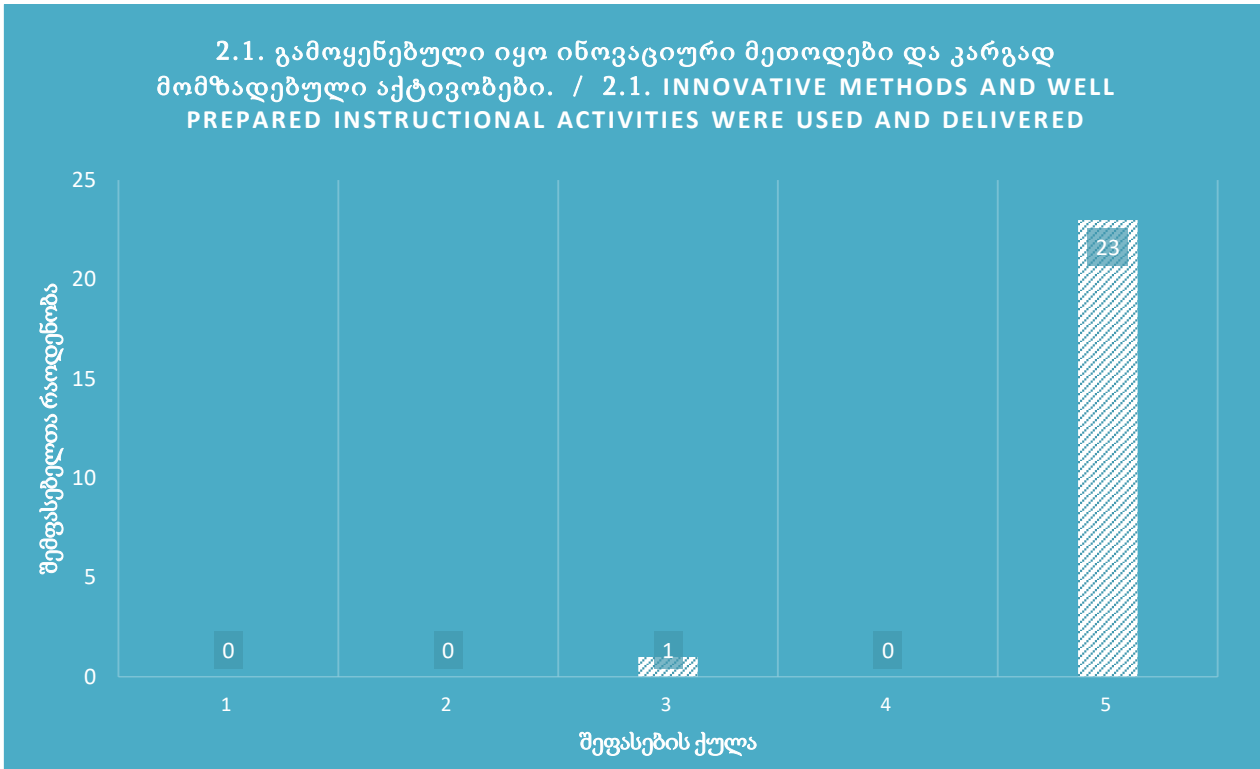

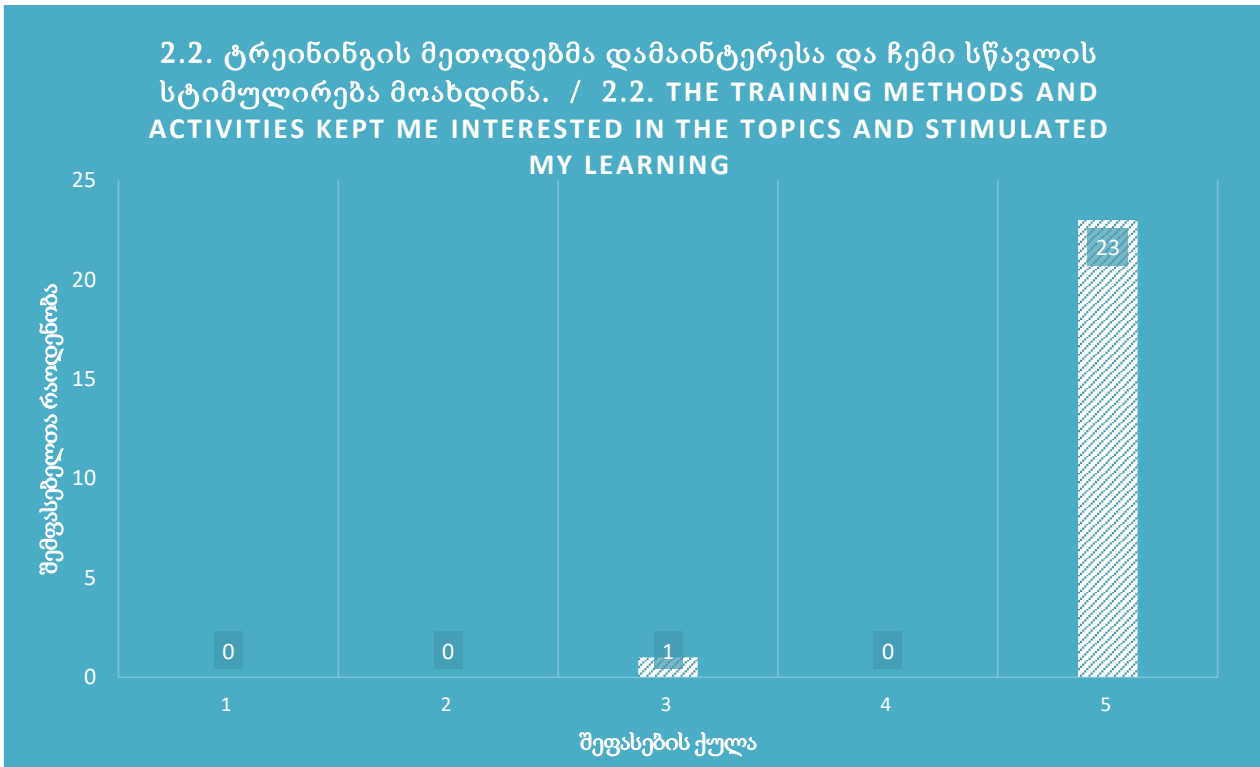

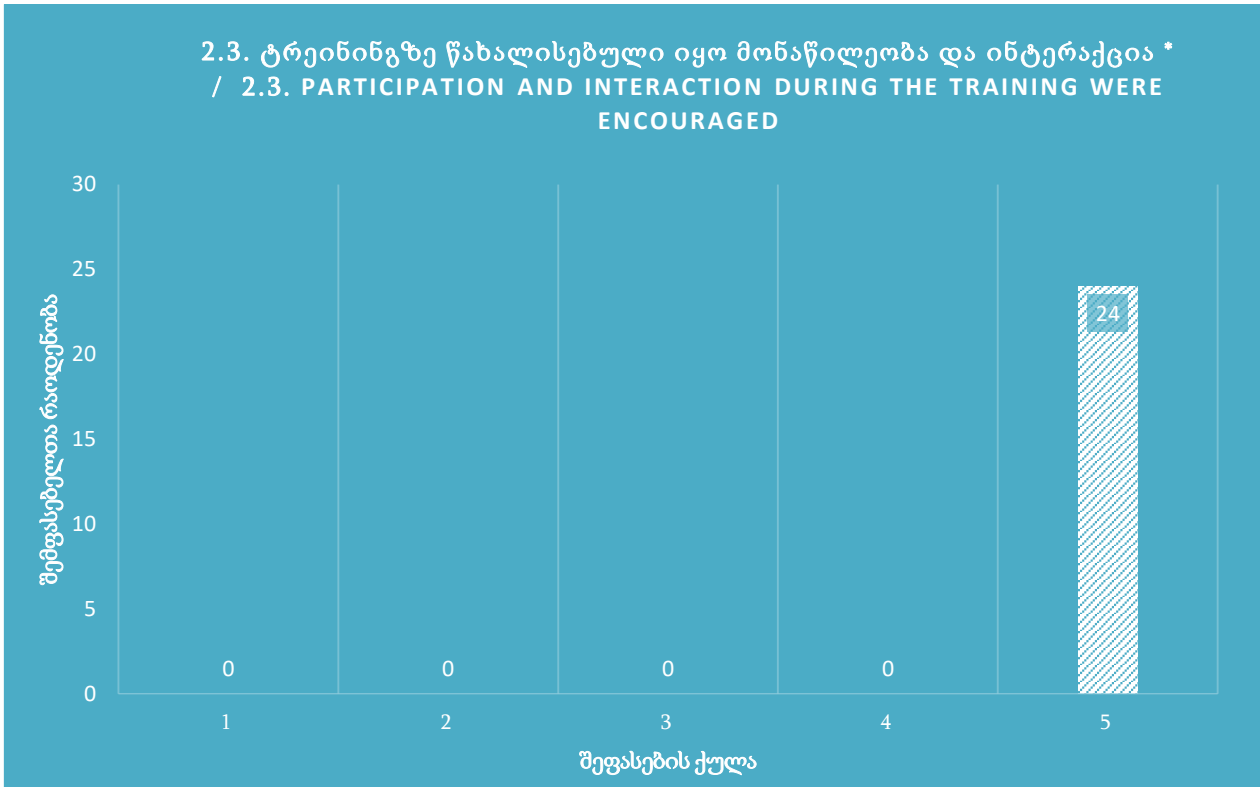

In Section 3, all the trainees unanimously (100 %) responded positively to all three questions, which go as follows: 3.1. Trainer was well-prepared (see Chart 7); 3.2. Trainer’s communication with the group was efficient; (see Chart 8); 3.3. The trainer used the time allotted for the training efficiently. (See Chart 9);

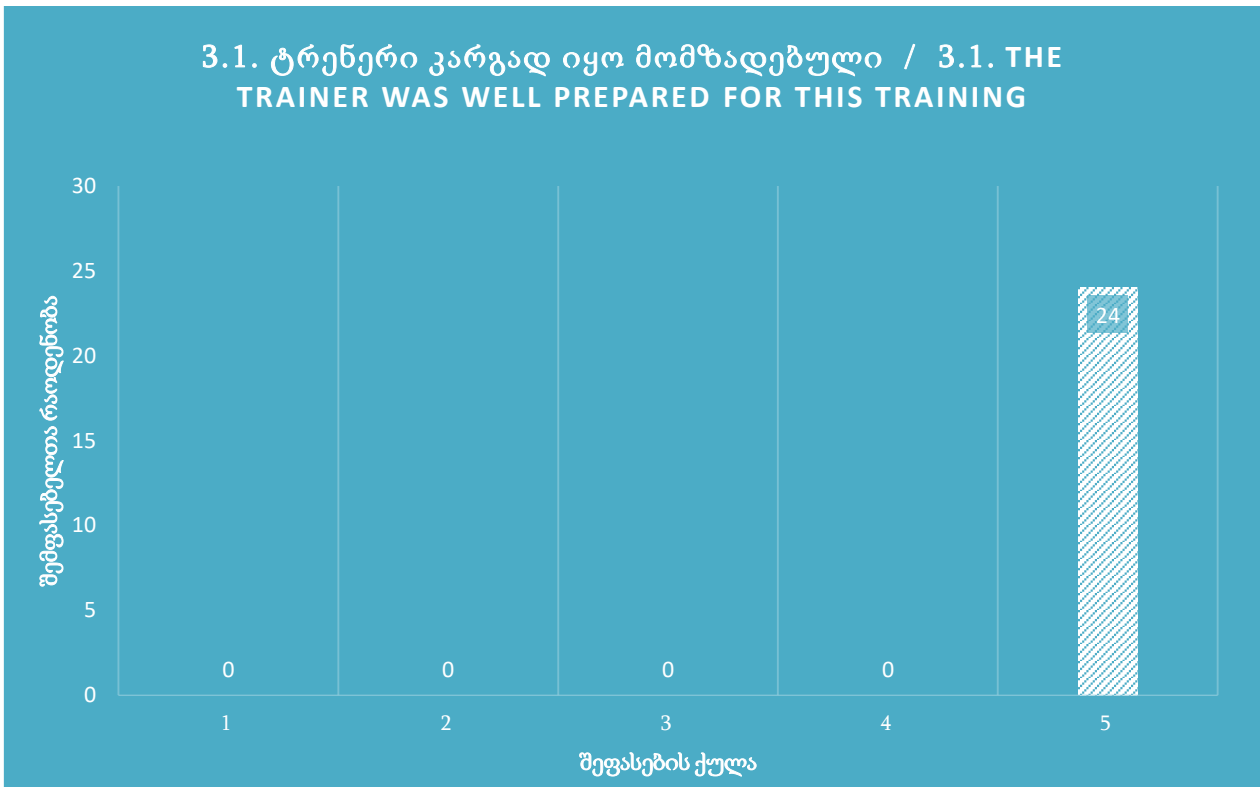

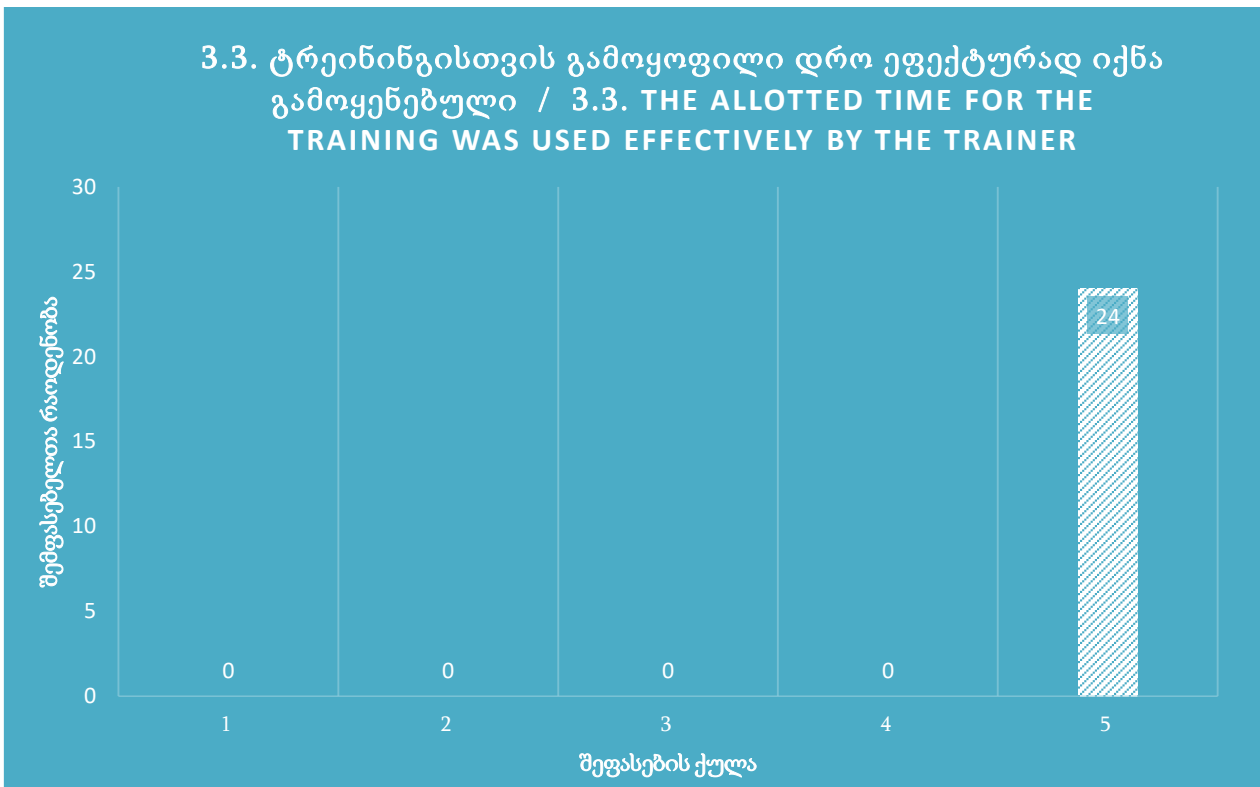

In Section 4, 22 out of 24 stated they acquired innovative and/or technology enhanced new skills needed for teaching/learning process (see Chart 10);. 23 out of 24 claimed they will be able to use newly acquired skills in practice (Chart 11); For question 4.3. 23 participants out of 24 were certain they would recommend this training to their colleagues (see Chart 12);

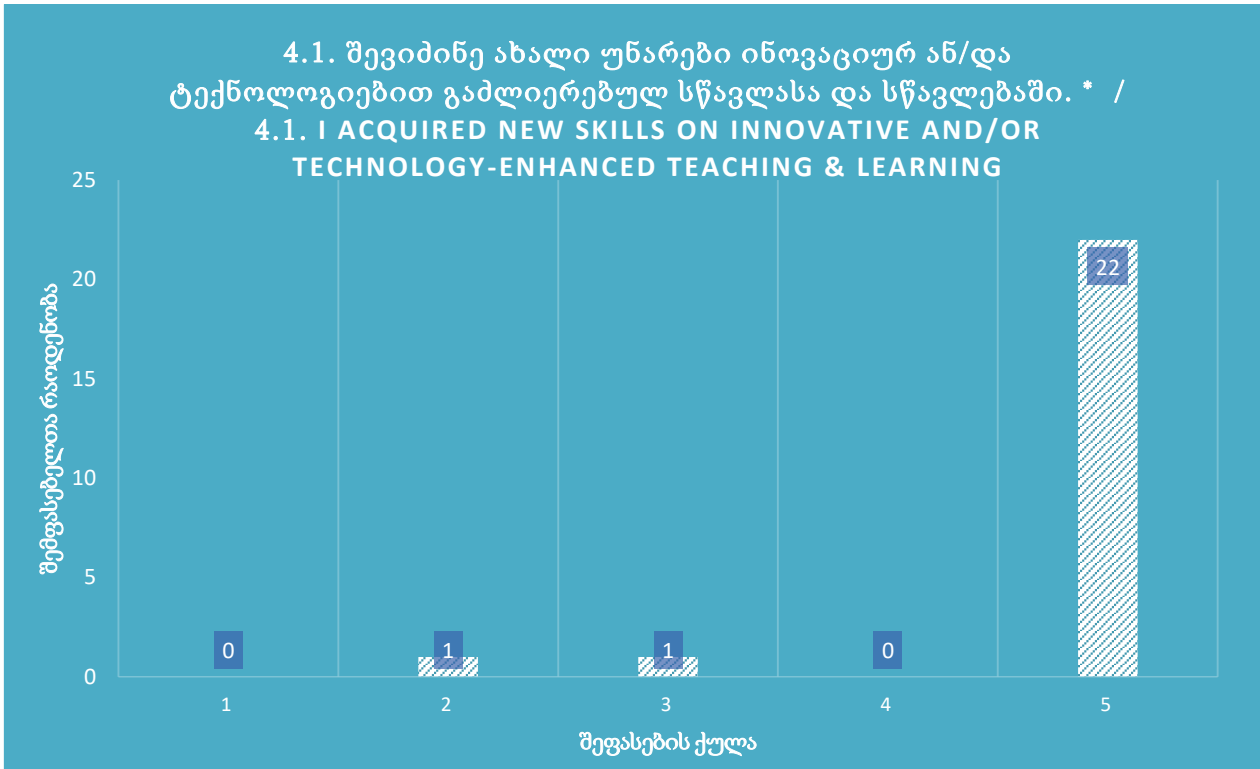

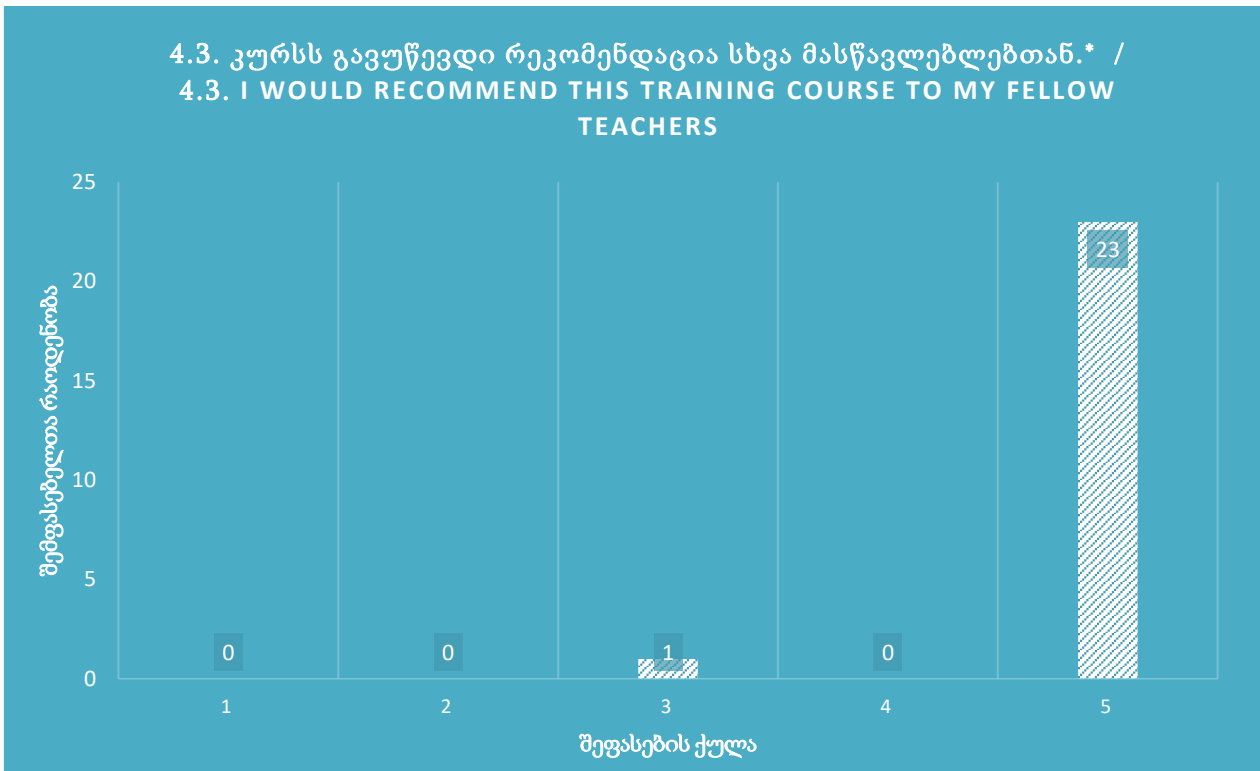

In Section 5, in 5.1. as to how they evaluated the overall training experience 23 out of 24 participants- 99% responded positively (Chart 13). Then came their individual intentions (5.2.). Almost all of them are eager and full of enthusiasm to use the newly acquired skills in their practice (see Table 1)
