Overview of the Training

5 day training course "Video as a learning tool for teachers and students" has been held at Georgian Technical University's Professional Development Center (March 04-09, 2019) and was attended by 20 lecturers from 7 different faculties and 2 members of Professional Development Center's staff. The trainer was Ms. Natia Kochladze who attended the training session with the same title at the University of Porto, Portugal in November 2018.

The trainees were introduced to the innovative methodology of teaching and learning using video.


During the training were discussed several concrete Teaching & Learning scenarios on how to use video as a learning tool to flip the class, stating that Audiovisual materials can convey and communicate complex information in a more motivating and memorable way creating richer learning experiences. Was held a discussion about the advantages and disadvantages of video lectures. The participants of the training discussed how to use video both on theoretical and practical levels to motivate and engage students and how the video could be used in their teaching fields.

The final day of the course was devoted to the presentation of short videos made by participants according their subjects of teaching and giving feedback.


After successful completion of the course the participants were awarded certificates.

Survey Results

At the end of the training the participants submitted evaluation forms. Out of 22 trainees we got 26 responses, because some trainees submitted repeatedly. The training objectives were evaluated in the **first section** of the five. 18 out of 22 trainees (that is 81.8%) agreed that the objectives of the training were clearly stated in syllabus (see Chart 1). Then, 21 out of 22 agreed that training content was ate to title and objectives of the course.




In Section 2, to the 2.1. question 17 trainees (77.3 %) agreed that the innovative methods and well prepared instructional activities were used and delivered in the course (see Chart 2). Also, 19 out of 22 and 17 out of 22 positively responded to 2.2 and 2.3 questions respectively.




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
In Section 3, 21 out of 22 trainees (95.5 %) responded positively to 3.1. - the trainer was well prepared for this training (see Chart 3); 21 out of 22 trainees (95.5 %) agreed that the trainer communicated well with the class (3.2.); 17 out of 22 trainees (77.3%) thought that the time allotted for the training was used effectively by the trainer (3.3.).



In Section 4, 17 out of 22 stated they acquired innovative and/or technology enhanced new skills needed for teaching/learning process (4.1.). 18 out of 22 claimed they will be able to use newly acquired skills in practice (4.2.); For question 4.3. 18 participants out of 22 were certain they would recommend this training to their colleagues.



In Section 5, in 5.1. as to how they evaluated the overall training experience 18 out of 22 responded positively (Chart 5). Then came their individual intentions (5.2.). Almost all of them have intension to use the newly acquired skills in their practice (see Table 1).
